One event – however successful – is only a part of the work. Forming stellar readers takes ongoing cooperation from every one of us – teachers, parents, grandparents, students, volunteers. Studies show that the number one thing a mom and dad can do to assure academic and lifelong learning success for their students is to **read to them every night**. Not only should we be reading to our students each evening and weekend, we need to **make sure our students are reading** alone silently and aloud to us. Our children's future happiness is at risk if they do not become stellar and life-long readers.

Let's boldly hold each other accountable and faithfully fulfill our commitment to form stellar readers. After all, when they get to Glendale Prep (the best high school in the nation, according to the President of Baylor), they will be reading great books, challenging and beautiful, deep and profound. They need all the reading star power they can get from their time at Archway Glendale.

Drop everything and read, tonight and every night. No excuses; no exceptions. Whatever time you can snatch, carve, or create to spend reading, do it. Every one of our students, every one of your children, is worth it!
