Headmaster's Corner

The first quarter of the 16-17 school year is nearly in the books, and there are so many good and great things happening at Archway Glendale! I hope you share my delight in what I see happening in our classes, in the hearts and minds of our students, on their joyful faces, in the dedication and care of our teachers, staff, and school families.

Our core purpose is to form hearts and minds in virtue and truth, and our thematic goal this year is to form stellar readers. I hope you have heard from your students how all of us at school are keeping the focus on reading progress, and I hope you, at home, are making reading to your children and listening to them read to you a top priority.
