*Please note that kindergarten will not be performing at this concert. The Kindergarten Concert Celebration will be held on Wednesday, May 15th, from 5 to 5:30 in the Glendale Prep gym.

First and second grade students must arrive by 4:45. Doors will open at 4:30. All students will go through the sanctuary to meet in one of the classrooms behind the stage. All students should wear a clean school uniform. Boys must wear pants. Girls may wear a jumper or pants. Please leave sweaters and sweatshirts at home or please keep them for your children.

Third through fifth grade students must arrive between 5:30 and 5:45. All students will go through the sanctuary to meet in one of the classrooms behind the stage. Third and fourth grade students should wear a clean school uniform. Boys must wear pants. Girls may wear a skirt or pants. Please leave sweaters and sweatshirts at home or please keep them for your children. Fifth grade students should dress in black and white dress attire. Boys should wear a white collared shirt with black dress slacks and black dress shoes. Ties are optional. Girls should wear a white blouse with a black skirt or black dress slacks and black dress shoes. A modest black dress is acceptable, as well. Open-toed shoes and reasonable heels are permitted.

Fifth Grade Promotion

The Archway Glendale Fifth Grade Promotion will be held in the Glendale Prep Gym beginning at 4. The doors will open at 3:30. The promotion will be followed by a reception in the MPR until 5:30. The dress code for fifth graders is listed below.

The semi-formal dress code for boys is: dress slacks (no jeans or patched pocket pants), a collared dress shirt, dark socks, dress shoes (no sneakers or sandals). No dyed hair or hats. Hair should be trimmed appropriately.

The semi-formal dress code for girls is as follows: modest-length skirts or dresses with hems that approach the knee, or appropriately fitting dress slacks; bare midriffs are not acceptable. Modestly cut sleeveless tops/dresses are allowed; girls may not wear strapless, spaghetti-strap, or tank tops. Girls should wear dress shoes. No flip-flops. Hair should be styled appropriately.

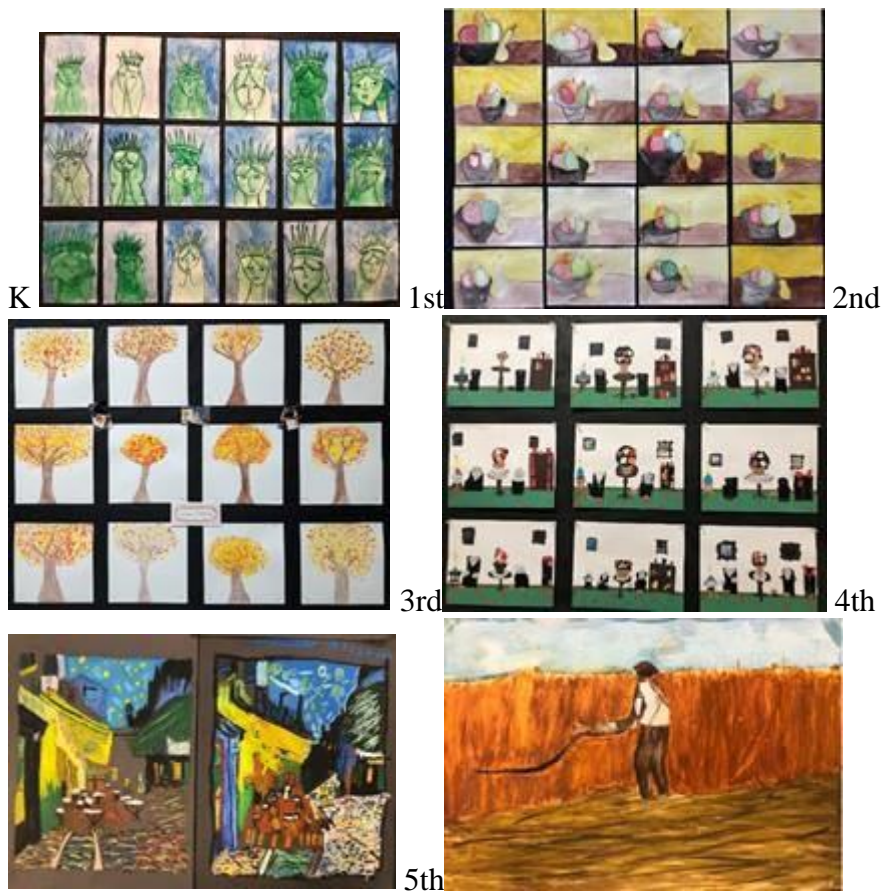

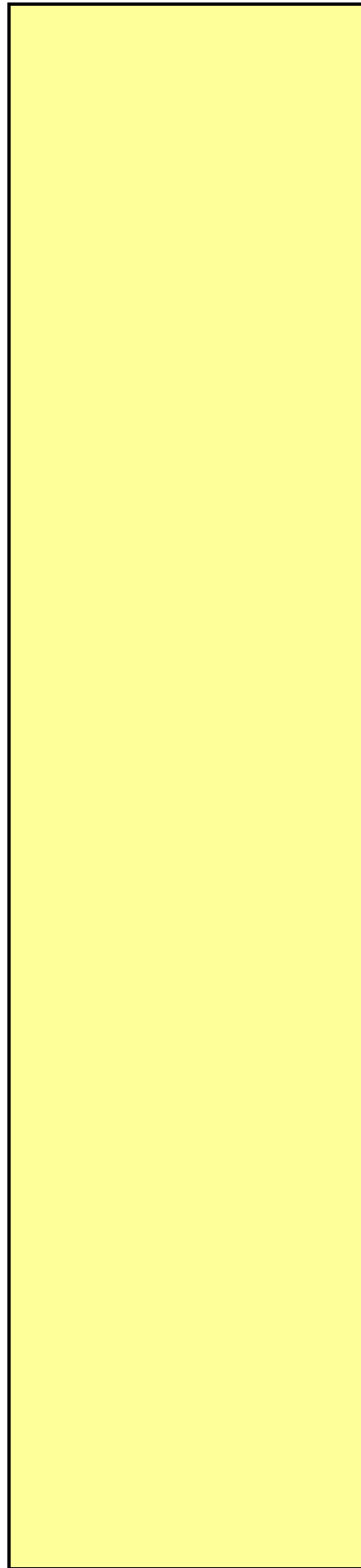
Great Hearts Gala - Save The Date!

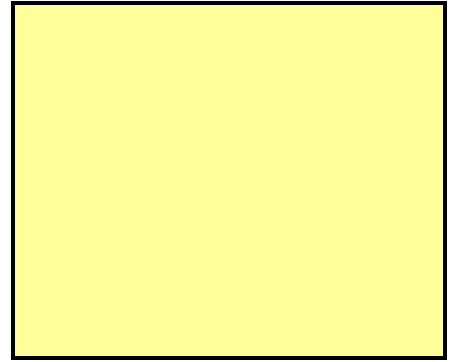
We want the very best for our students. We should not/will not settle for
