Zoom Safety

It is very important that we create a safe environment for all Archway Glendale students and teachers. Here are some tips that you can do to partner with us in creating that safe environment:

- 1. Change the display name to your student's first name and last initial when attending synchronous sessions. This can be done by clicking on the three dots located in the corner right box of the screen.
- 2. Make sure your child has a wall behind him rather than your home environment, if possible.
- 3. Do not share Zoom links with anyone.
- 4. Do not record the session or take photos.

These are the things Archway Glendale will do to help:

- 1. Have all attendees wait in a waiting room. (Having the student names displayed will help teachers let in the correct students.)
- 2. All attendees will have audio and video disabled upon entry.

Change in Weekly Teacher Communication

At Meet the Teacher this week your child's teacher may have mentioned doing weekly live Zoom sessions in lieu of weekly newsletters. In an effort to be considerate of possible parent scheduling conflicts, teachers will be posting a weekly recorded video in the Google Classroom by Friday afternoon. These videos will contain information, tips, etc. to

help you and your child during 100% Distance Learning.

Teacher Assignments

Teacher assignments were made after all the Return to Learning Forms were complete. Archway Glendale teachers and administration used the data to create classes that were as balanced and solid as possible. Unfortunately, we are unable to guarantee that your child will have the same teacher when he returns to brick and mortar learning.

Backpacks

Backpacks will not be used when students return to brick and mortar, at least for the first quarter. Students will only bring a lunchbox, water bottle, and mask to school each day. Temporarily eliminating backpacks will help for several reasons:

1. Eliminates the use of cubbies so that desks can be spread out more. 2. Saves time in packing and unpacking the backpack because time is being lost elsewhere in the day with other new safety procedures. 3. Reduces paperwork and passing of germs. 4. Encourages students to bring the bare minimum supplies to school. 5. Allows for maximum room between desks without backpacks slung over the back of student chairs.

This summer is the hardest I've ever worked as a Great Hearts Headmaster, and I believe our teachers and staff are also working harder than ever.
