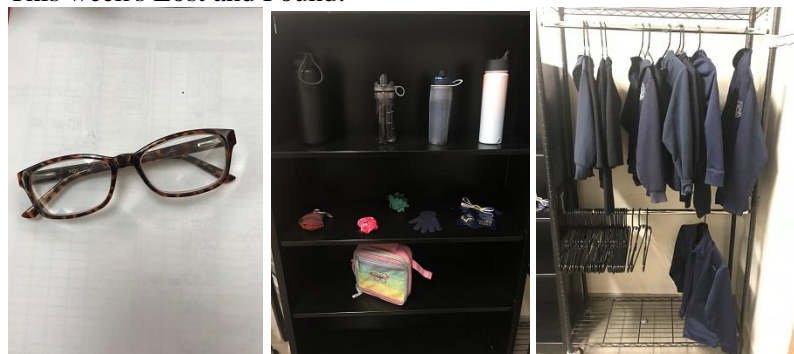

Headmaster Corner

Trust.

The foundational virtue.

The past month or so I have been writing to you about trust, how important it is for school success, and how each of us can learn to practice high-trust behaviors to contribute to that success.

The first three high-trust behaviors are talk straight, demonstrate respect, and create transparency.

We know that in these three areas we (and others) often fail. People make mistakes – sometimes we intentionally, and often unintentionally, hurt those with whom we live and work. Those wrongs need to be recognized, and once we recognize them, admitted, and once we admit them, we need to find a way to right those wrongs, to do something (or several things) positive to make up for the wrong we have done. The sooner the better.

People know that other people make mistakes, just like we know we make mistakes of our own. Most people are willing to forgive, especially when the person gives us every sign of being willing to make up for the wrong and strive to avoid wronging us in the future. Often, a new and deeper level of trust can be attained than if the wrong had never been committed in the first place.

This beautiful and wonderful time of the year is a great time to renew our commitment to become a trustworthy person, one who talks straight, demonstrates respect, creates transparency, and rights wrongs.

May peace and joy reign in our hearts, our homes, and our school in this bright season of hope!

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
