#### **SARRC**

This year, Archway Glendale will be working with the Southwest Autism Research & Resource Center (SARRC) on a project regarding a universal screening for social challenges in public schools. The idea is that screening children for social challenges early and identifying and addressing those challenges will have a significant positive effect on their school experience. All students in 2nd and 4th grade will be screened by their teachers in two weeks, unless their parent or guardian chooses to opt out of the screening. # **Headmaster Corner**

Trust is a precious commodity, hard to earn, easy to lose. Without it, nothing good can happen in human relationships and no great results can come of our labors. Let us renew a commitment to become trustworthy persons who practice the 13 high-trust behaviors.

Two of our greatest presidents, Washington and Lincoln, were men of their word and men of action, men who could be trusted, men who talked straight, demonstrated respect, created transparency, righted wrongs, showed loyalty, delivered results, got better, and confronted reality. They also practiced the 9<sup>th</sup> high trust behavior: clarify expectations.

Washington clarified expectations for his men and the Continental Congress regarding what it would take to defeat the British Superpower and win American Freedom.

Lincoln clarified his expectations that victory in the Civil War could lead to a rebirth of a nation committed to the self-evident truth declared by our Founding Fathers that "all men are created equal and endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights."

Great leaders disclose measurable and observable expectations – clear and verifiable. They do not assume clarity, nor do they assume shared commitment, but they over-communicate clarity and probe for conflict until a commitment is real and deep for everyone. Leaders and ideal team members live by the expectations they have set forth, renegotiating them when circumstances demand and recommitting to the new and clearer expectations.

It takes courage and perseverance to clarify and live by expectations. Trust is worth it, and trust cannot exist without clearly communicated expectations.
