REPORT CARDS:

The school office will be open until 3:30 pm today, from 7:00 am to 3:30 pm tomorrow (9/30) and from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm on Tuesday, 10/11.

Please use your discretion as your child's primary educator in determining the appropriateness of showing the report card to your child. Report cards and evaluations are meant to be a communication tool between you and your child's teacher, and you should decide whether it will help or hinder your child's learning to share them.

CONFERENCES:

Conferences will be held on Wednesday, 10/12, and Thursday, 10/13. For those of you who signed up for a Zoom conference, please watch the classroom newsletter or email for a link from the teacher. If you do not have the link by 10/11, please contact your child's teacher directly.

GRADING:

Kindergarten through second grade teachers and all specials teachers grade on a numerical 1 to 4 scale. Please see the standards tab on the Great Hearts Parent Portal.

Third through fifth grade teachers grade on an A-F scale. Please see the traditional tab on the Great Hearts Parent Portal.

At Great Hearts, grades are not merely "crunched" by averaging test scores. Teachers evaluate each student's mastery level of material, participation in classroom discussions, sense of wonder, depth of inquiry, quality in assignments, and homework completion.
